Airfield Guide Europe Chart

LDM-news interviewed Jürgen Mies, Head of the German Aeronautical Publication Agency, about the Airfield Guide Europe Chart.

LDM-news: Mr Mies, you are the expert to consult when it comes to DFS aeronautical charts. You designed and produced the Airfield Guide Europe, for which you received the ATCA Award last November. What is the Airfield Guide Europe Chart exactly?

Jürgen Mies: "The Airfield Guide Europe Chart is an aeronautical chart which depicts more than 2,800 aerodromes in Europe. This chart can be used together with our Airfield Guide Europe for planned flights to our European neighbours and even to different aerodromes in Germany. If, for example, you want to fly to Tønder in Denmark, you will find all the information you need in the Airfield Guide Europe. You just need to take one look at the Airfield Guide Europe Chart to see where the respective aerodrome in Denmark is located. Gone are the days of having to examine the customary national charts. "

LDM-news: What are the best features of the Airfield Guide Europe Chart?

Jürgen Mies: "All countries in Europe have a designated ICAO code. These codes are clearly visible on the chart. The chart also shows whether the aerodromes are civil or military. Highlights of the topography are its impressive layout and radiant colours. Europe is portrayed on two scales (Europe in 1:4,000,000 and central Europe in 1:2,000,000)." ←



"Sprechfunk im Instrumentenflug" – new publication

DFS has just published the textbook "Sprechfunk im Instrumentenflug" which provides help in preparing for the exam on the General Aeronautical Radio Operator's Certificate (AZF).

Instrument procedures, radiotelephony procedures, radio navigation systems, airspace organisation, rules of the air, legal principles, authorities and organisations are explained in detail by the authors Jens Lange and Gerald Wilde. Both authors have experience as trainers and with aeronautical radio certificates and air law.

The authors provide many realistic and logical examples for air/ground communication between the pilot and the air navigation services, hence facilitating practice-oriented learning. In addition, the book contains the entire catalogue of exam questions from the Ministry of Transport, Building and Housing (BMVBW).

It is an ideal supplement to the already successful "Sprechfunk im Sichtflug" and, according to many experts, the most practice-oriented book in its field. ←
