That's quite a statement. The group's aim is to act in the interest of the members


and find solutions to any problems that might arise, in the meantime not just related to the *Malibu Mirage* .

The plan was that at 13:00 each participant would arrive at the Beachhouse, high above the beach, in Westerland for lunch.








The food was varied and good. Everyone had fun and enjoyed being together again.
