Friday, 13th June, 2025



Traveling by boat is, of course, the obvious thing to do on the lake. We were lucky enough to be able to use two historic boats from 1924 - the Lorelei and the Loretto - for a round-trip on Lake Wörthersee. The journey took us from Seefels Castle past Velden, Dellach, Pörtschach, Maria Wörth and Reifnitz to the Restaurant Loretto.

We passed Peter Alexander's villa and those of many other celebrities who appreciate the special atmosphere at Lake Wörthersee.



Lake Wörthersee has always been known for its beautiful turn-of-the-century villas and its water, which can be as warm as 25°C.



The "Falkensteiner Hotel" in Velden beside the famous Wörthersee in a film-worthy setting.

"Actually, the **Falkensteiner Schlosshotel Velden am Wörthersee** is 'only' a **5-Star Hotel** in Austria. Originally it did in fact serve as Baron von Aichelberg's residence directly on Lake Wörthersee. *Bartholomäus Khevenhüller* (1539-1613) had the castle built, the character of which can still be seen in its four towers.

However, it became much more famous in 1890, when it was converted into a hotel. From 1952 onwards, it was used as a **filming location for cinema and TV productions.** The best known is probably the RTL series *Ein Schloss am Wörthersee*, which was filmed there from 1990 to 1992. One of the main roles was played by the well-known pop singer *Roy Black*, who died in 1991. He is still remembered today with a memorial bust not far from the castle." Many people find the Catholic church in Maria Wörth also well-worth seeing.



Reifnitz Castle is now privately owned, but it remains one of the sights at Maria Wörth – a great photo opportunity!



We had booked lunch at the well-known restaurant "Maria Loretto" for 1 o'clock. The vintage boats were able to dock right next to the restaurant. As far as we know, the members were most satisfied.



At around 3 o'clock, three vintage convertible buses were already waiting for us to take us on a special excursion to Klagenfurt. The tour through Klagenfurt was scheduled to last an hour and a half.



The **Lindworm Fountain** on the New Square in Klagenfurt am Wörthersee from the 16th century represents the town's heraldic animal, a Lindworm.

The completed work, weighing 6 tons and made of chlorite slate, is said to have been transported to the New Square by 300 white-clad youths in 1593. In 1636 the Hercules-Statue by the Gurker sculptor Michael Hönel was added to the ensemble. The club-wielding Hercules reduces the effect of the heraldic fountain, but recalls the legend of Klagenfurt's founding. The dragon is said to have been slain by brave men in the area surrounding the Carinthian state capital, thus making the area safe and habitable.

According to a legend, Lake Wörthersee was created by too much wealth

However, he was only laughed at and sent away. Later, he returned. This time, he had a barrel under his arm. Once again, he urged the revelers to stop their drinking. Otherwise, the barrel would open, and death and destruction would befall the city's inhabitants. Once again, no one listened to his advice!

When the church bells struck midnight, it was too late. All the lights went out, the walls shook, and a terrible thunderstorm broke out. Vast quantities of water poured from the barrel.

The rain didn't stop until the whole city had been swallowed up by water. This is how Lake Wörthersee was created.
